# SHREE BIRENDRA HOSPITAL, CHHAUNI ACTIVITIES IN THE YEAR POUSH 2059 - MARGA 2060 



Shree Birendra Hospital Chhauni is the continuation of Tri Chandra Military hospital, which was established on $9^{\text {th }}$ September 1926 A.D. Tri Chandra Military hospital was dedicated to the glory of Sri Pashupati Nath and to the memory of those brave sons of the Kingdom of Nepal who fell in the Great War 1914-1918 A.D. and the field of responsibility was to provide health service to the Royal Nepalese army personnel. In the year 2032 B.S. Shree Tri Chandra Military hospital extended its services to the Ex-servicemen and families. Between B.S. 2040-2050, the need of reorganization and expansion of the hospital was felt because of increasing number of patients. Royal Nepalese Army agreed to build a new hospital, and the result was Shree Birendra Hospital, Chhauni.

Shree Birendra Hospital, Chhauni is a 380 bedded, moderately equipped, with almost all basic speciality hospital. Post accident unit, a vital wing of the hospital is rendering service to all post accident, civilian casualities also. As the size of the Royal Nepalese Army is getting bigger and bigger every year, so the responsibility of the hospital is also increasing. We all have

understood the reality of inadequacy in rendering adequate health service to the given population. For the last 2 years the number of patients visiting this hospital has almost doubled. This is because (i) increasing size of the Royal Nepalese Army (ii) migration of Army families/ex-servicemen and families to the capital because of threat and fear of retaliation by Maoist insurgents.

It has been realised by us and the RNAHQ that even this hospital is inadequate (space + manpower and field of speciality wise) to render adequate and good quality service. We are planning to extended this hospital to a 500 bedded hospital. It is high time now we should set the priority field in this hospital, which field is to be developed in the superspecialized level. This being an army hospital, also entertaining the civilian trauma victims, developing this institution as a super-specialized trauma center with all the physical facilities and specialized man power will not be a bad idea. To make this come true we should have good neuro surgery, orthopaedics and trauma surgery, reconstructive surgery and vascular surgery unit with well trained man power (doctors, nurses and paramedics) and necessary equipments and physical facilities. Training should be concentrated for surgery, nursing and paramedics. The population receiving medical service from Birendra hospital Chhauni are:

Level of activities in providing health service has been very high. Service starts from outpatients department (GOPD). GOPD opens up round the clock, which used to be manned by only one medical officer earlier but now because of increasing load, it is been manned by 2 doctors and 4 paramedics round the clock. GOPD receives the regular patients, treats, refers to specialised OPD and admits the emergency cases after initial management. The average patient turnout in GOPD is 300 per working day.

All the trauma cases are received and managed in the trauma hall, which is manned by different set of doctors and paramedical staff. The number of trauma cases are also increasing with an average of 10 patients per day.

The family OPD is heavily overloaded with an average of 17000 patients per month

The surgical division was already busy with the regular patient load, however with the increasing involvement of the security forces to counter the Maoist activities, the number of combat casualties has increased
tremendously and thus the responsibility of the surgical division. Patients with gunshot wounds and mine blast injuries often need more than one operation. There is often multisystem involvement. The worst are mine blast injuries. Operation theatre actively is as follows
