# A brief Account of Geography Teaching at Prithvi Narayan Campus, Pokhara

### Abstract

This article provides a brief yet comprehensive account of the development of geography teaching at Prithvi Narayan Campus, Pokhara, since its initiation in 1962. It explores the historical background of the Department of Geography, its foundation, and gradual evolution in the context of higher education expansion in western Nepal. The methods of the study is based on qualitative analysis of institutional records, archival documents, internal publications, and relevant literature. Both primary and secondary data sources were utilized, particularly campus and departmental archives. The study aims to document significant milestones in the department's journey, identify and acknowledge the contributions of both national and international faculty members, and highlight the department's academic progress, including its infrastructure, research activities, and curricular expansion. Notable developments include the introduction of Bachelor's and Master's programs, incorporation of population studies, and the establishment of a GIS and Remote Sensing laboratory with international collaboration. The department has also made notable contributions to applied research, academic seminars, and training programs over the decades.

## Introduction

Along with the beginning of the process of modern development of Pokhara valley itself as well as Nepal, Prithvi Narayan Intermediate College was established in Pokhara on 1<sup>st</sup> September 1960 (17<sup>th</sup> Bhadra 2017 B.S.). This happened just after

one year of the establishment of Tribhuvan University, Parent institution of higher learning in Nepal, as a state funding university in 1959. In its inception, it was started as an intermediate level of art college. This step towards the beginning of higher education at Pokhara was the outcome of the ever increasing number of school leaving graduates (in those days this was known as matriculation and later as school leaving certificate- SLC) during the decade of 2010 B.S. In this entire process of development, the role of the then self-motivated social servants at various walks of life and education lovers of Pokhara valley was so crucial and significant. Their active involvement to lay down the foundation stone of higher education in and around Pokhara valley also became highly significant for its further development.

However, somehow the establishment of Prithvi Narayan Intermediate college of Pokhara municipality yields an eye opening opportunity towards further expansion of higher education in Pokhara including the entire region of west Nepal for the first time in history out of Kathmandu valley with the purpose of addressing increasing demand of the people.

Geography teaching in Prithvi Narayan Campus was started by American Peace Corps Volunteer Mr. Peter Farquhar in 1962. Another American Peace Corps Volunteer Miss Dorothy Mierow also joined the then College in 1963 and taught geography. Prof. Dr. Madhav Prasad Tripathi, a geography post-graduate from University of Gorakhpur, India, entered into this Department as a geography teacher in 1967. Since then, he led the Department in different capacities up to 2006. In 1967 the Bachelor's Degree in geography was opened. During the days of 1969/70, Mr. Wasim Ahamad and Mr. Shribastav, both from India, came to this Department as geography teachers. They taught geography in this Department for about a year. In 1970, Prof. Dr. Birendra Singh Gurung, Post-Graduate from University of Ranchi, India, joined this Department and served up to 2007.

Later, the classes of Intermediate and Bachelor's Degree in geography education were also conducted within this Department. The then Primary School Teacher's Training (Normal Training) Centre of Bhimkali Patan was affiliated to Prithvi Narayan Campus as a Faculty of Education under the nationalization programme of Higher Education in 1973. The Department offered the post-graduate level (Master Degree) in 1979. This post graduate level in geography teaching started after seventeen years of its inception in 1962.

Apart from these geography classes, the Department had also conducted classes of population Studies from Intermediate to Post-graduate level (Intermediate, 1993; Bachelor, 1996 and Post-graduate, 2008) as this Programme was affiliated into this Department since 1993. This affiliation program of population studies continued until its own full-fledged establishment of the department of population studies.

At the outset, apart from the compulsory subjects a few optional subjects were included in the teaching of Prithvi Narayan College. Among these optional subjects geography was one but its teaching was started in 1962, two years later after the establishment of Prithvi Narayan college itself. In this preview note an attempt has been made to record the brief profile of this department, since its inception. How the geography teaching started in this department and series of development took place? Who and how many geographers were involved to render the teaching and continued the service? are being included in this preview. For this, necessary data were taken/collected from the existing department and campus record itself and the secondary sources as well.

The objectives of this article are to document the historical development and key milestones of geography teaching at Prithvi Narayan Campus since its inception in 1962; to identify and recognize the contributions of both national and international faculty members in the establishment and growth of the Department of Geography; and to highlight the department's academic capabilities, research activities, and infrastructural advancements, including the establishment of GIS/Remote Sensing, population studies, and postgraduate programs.

# Methodology

This study is primarily based on qualitative research methods using both primary and secondary sources. Historical records and archived departmental documents from the Department of Geography, Prithvi Narayan Campus, were thoroughly reviewed to trace the chronological development of geography teaching. Additional information was obtained through departmental records, internal publications, and institutional reports. The study also incorporates relevant literature including faculty contributions and milestone academic events. Secondary sources such as journals, publication of Golden Jubilee of Prithvi Narayan Campus, and seminar proceedings were used to support and validate the institutional narrative. The data were synthesized to present a coherent account of the department's evolution and academic significance.

# **Capability of the Department**

This Department is equipped with surveying and cartographic laboratory, visual display, portraits, departmental library and Seminar hall. The GIS (Geographic Information Systems) laboratory had also been established in this Department with the support provided by Professor Shunji Murai of the University of Tokyo, Japan in 1997. Since then the Department has been offering academic courses on GIS and Remote Sensing for the Bachelor and post-graduate level students in geography. This department also offers training courses in GIS for its faculties, professionals from

various organizations and disciplines and the students. 'The Himalayan Geographers' is the Journal which is published by this Department since 2001. This year the publication of journal completed its 25<sup>th</sup> years. That's why, this issue of the journal is published as the silver jubilee special issue of the department. Besides this, the department of geography has been providing the thesis writing as its academic course. In thesis writing students mostly based on fieldwork and generate the primary data including the collection of data as secondary sources too. Then ultimately they prepare the thesis/dissertation under the continual supervision of an assigned supervisor. The total number of dissertations so far submitted and awarded by this Department is one hundred and fifty Three till the date. In addition, if this department add its own departmental memorial section (like departmental museum) will enrich the departmental capability for further attraction. This will be additional sweet smell in the gold.

This team again prepared a joint study report mainly based on the causes of flesh flood including its further implication. This report was also presented in public gathering in the then sub-metropolitan city of Pokhara.

Compared to the previous position, this shrunk scenario of involved teaching faculty in the department shows somehow uneasy situation. They are being over loaded on the one hand and the existing academic program is also being under hardship to the other. This situation of geography teaching including other core subjects is not being encouraging in higher education level. This existing scenario of core subjects in higher education of university level should have prompt correction to bring back into its satisfactory level. The existing situation and scenario of the departments of previous popular core subjects is being a matter of serious consideration in university level education.

In essence, the department of geography, Prithvi Narayan Campus, Pokhara, is one of the oldest geography teaching departments of Nepal. The departmental dedication in geography teaching has always remained exemplary and praiseworthy. Within the period of almost six and half decades since its inception in 1962, this department has produced thousands of geography graduate and post graduate students. Their contribution in raising and spreading geographical knowledge among the students has remained immense. But in later period the importance of these core subjects has somehow remained under shadow and that space has been increasingly been occupied by other professional subjects even in the university level education.

This has somehow reduced the limit of academic activities and ultimate role of these core subjects in the system of higher education. However, this on going adverse situation in higher education system should be corrected in time. Otherwise, the fathomless importance of the knowledge of these core subjects will gradually be defaced and will loose their focus in the system of higher education. Ultimately, this defacing trend of the importance of these core subjects in university level teaching is well connected with the root of secondary and lower secondary level education. It should be corrected or improved from the point of these foundations with thematic seriousness followed by appropriate tools and techniques.

Anyway, geography as an academic discipline is the reliable bridge between natural and social sciences. This is already an established norm in education system. The study of geography neither goes as below the geologist go nor goes above as the meteorologist go from the surface of the earth. The study of geography mainly confined to assess, describe, evaluate, explore and analyze all the intricately spreaded/distributed spatial phenomenon within and near the surface of the earth and their interaction with each other as well as its outcome.

With this factual realization, teaching geography should go seriously ahead by spreading its crucial role in the mechanism of all round development of the immediate society in particular and country as a whole in general.
